Maths: Measurement - Time

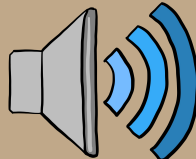
To identify how long it takes to get ready for school.

Handwriting Learning Intention:

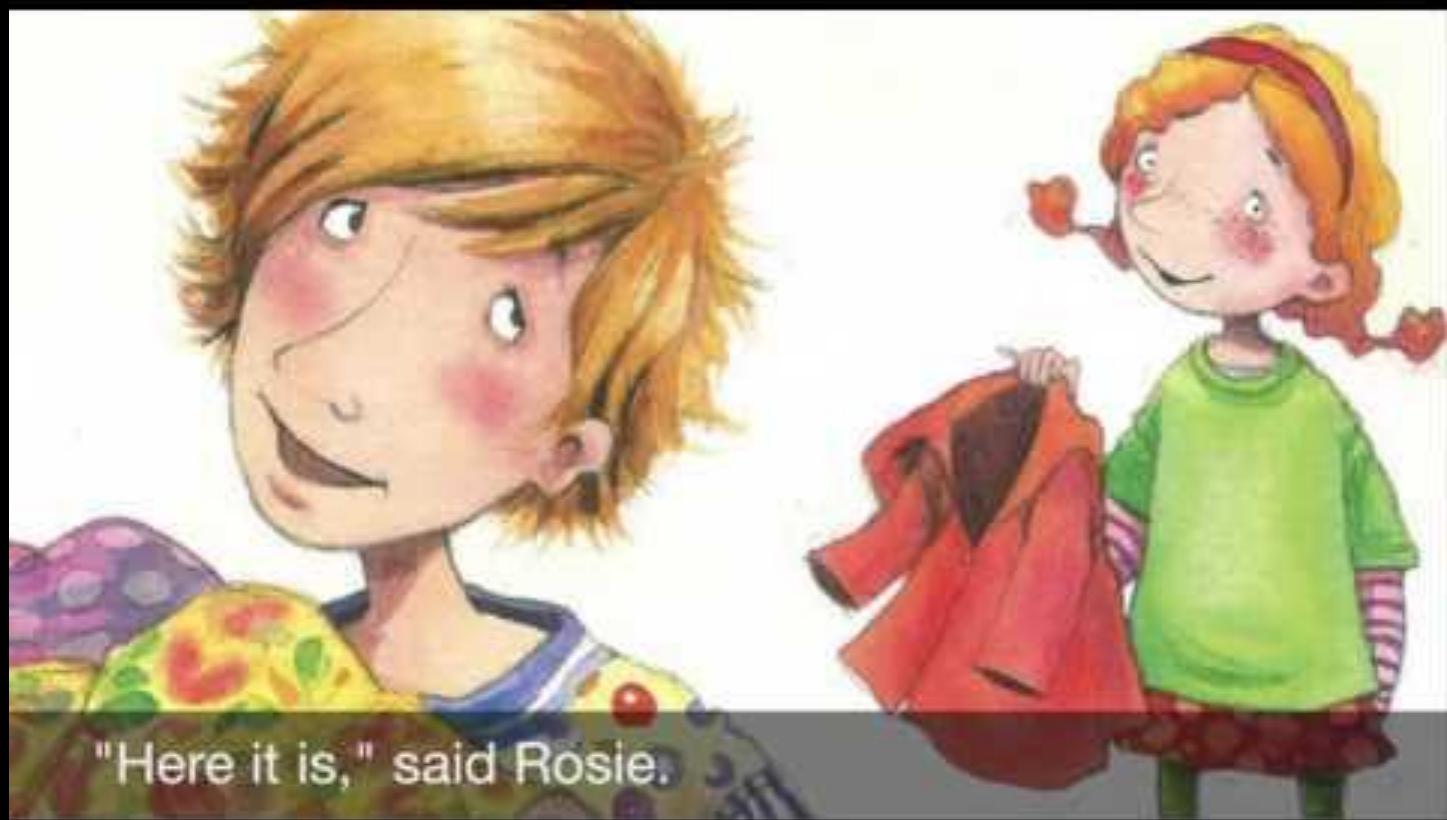
